

Spring Term Year 1

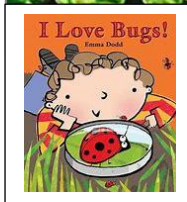


English

We are reading

- The Three Little pigs (traditional tales story writing)
- Sequencing our sentences
- Punctuation.

Maths

- 3D and 2D shape.
- Numbers up to 20.
- Addition and subtraction within 20.
- Numbers to 50.
- Introducing length and height.
- Introducing mass and weight.



Science

In science this term the children will be learning about our senses and animal features.

In term 4 we will learn about seasonal changes and length of day and night.

DT

In a Year 1 Design Technology unit, students design, build, and evaluate freestanding structures using a range of materials. They explore different ways to create stable constructions, learning about balance and support through hands-on activities. After building their structures, students evaluate their designs, reflecting on what worked well

Art

In Year 1, children will learn about a different artist each term. They will be able to describe the differences and similarities and make links to their own work.

In the spring term, children will study David Bomberg
They will be:

- Drawing buildings and then bridges.
- Using different media to draw bridges that Isambard Kingdom Brunel designed.

History

- Looking at how transport has changed.

Music



Sounds of the seaside

In this new unit, children make links between music, sounds and environments and use percussion, vocal and body sounds to represent the seaside.

RE (Judaism)
